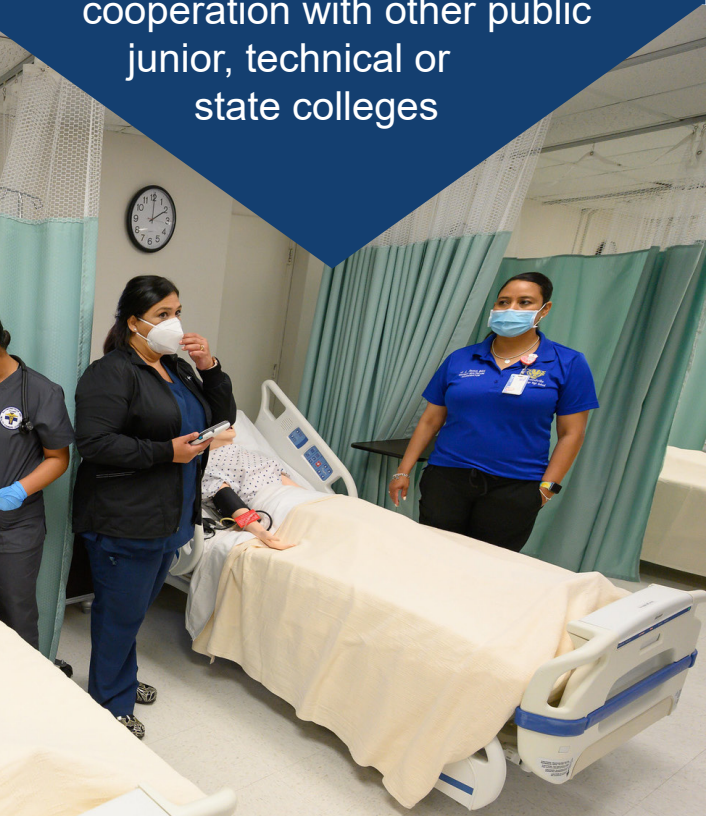
Jobs & Education for Texans (JET)



WHICH PROGRAMS ARE ELIGIBLE?

JET grants support the purchase of equipment connected to new or expanding CTE programs which:

- Prepare students for employment in local high-demand occupations;
- Lead to a license, certificate, or postsecondary degree; and
- Are provided in school districts in cooperation with other public junior, technical or state colleges



ELIGIBLE GRANTEEES INCLUDE

- Public junior, state, or technical colleges
- ISDs, and open-enrollment charter schools entered into a partnership with a public junior, state, or technical college
- Windham School District



HOW MUCH CAN YOU APPLY FOR IN 2025?

- All eligible entities (public junior, state, or technical colleges; ISDs, and open-enrollment charter schools entered into a partnership with a public junior, state, or technical college; and the Windham School District) can submit one application for this RFA period.
- Applicants may request between \$40,000-\$375,000





HOW MUCH FUNDING IS AVAILABLE?

For the 2025 JET grant RFA cycle, approximately \$15 million of general revenue will be available for applications from all eligible institutions.

Applications will be competitively ranked and must meet a minimum threshold of 600 points (or 60% of the total possible score of 1,000 points).
